Select Board Letter

Dear Fellow Citizens of Blue Hill,

2024 was a busy year for your Select Board. Our two newest members, Ben Adams and James Wootten, elected by you at our 2024 Town Meeting, jumped right into the work. We were aided by our Town Administrator, Julie Atwell, our town office staff and a variety of volunteer committees. Municipal government is an increasingly complex undertaking that requires dedicated people, which we are fortunate to have.

Some of the many municipal issues of 2024 are highlighted below.

* Roads. Always an issue of major concern. In 2024 the total reconstruction of the Mountain Road was completed. It like so many other roads in town was never properly built but rather was just regularly repaved after being regularly broken apart by the frost. This was the second major town road reconstruction over the last few years, both based on a priority analysis of all our town roads done for the town by an engineering firm. Other roads will need similar work over the next few years, but only minor road projects are planned for 2025.

* Revaluation of Real Estate. To comply with state law and to ensure fairness, a total revaluation of all real estate in Town was completed, the first revaluation in many, many years. This increased the total valuation of all real estate in town and a significant decrease in the tax rate. As with most revaluations, this led to an increase in tax for a third of property owners, a decrease for a third and no significant change for a third. The Select Board, which is also the Board of Assessors, handled many abatement requests based on incorrect assessment information.

* New Comprehensive Plan. A volunteer citizens committee spent months gathering information, holding public meetings and drafting a new comprehensive plan for our Town. The state of Maine has approved the draft and it will now be presented to the voters on the referendum ballot on April 5. If approved by voters, it will give the town access to state funding sources as well as help guide decisions about future town work priorities.

* Water Access Land Gift: The Town now has another public access point to Blue Hill Bay, thanks to a gift from Maine Coast Heritage Trust.

The Nub, so-called, off Rte 175, was set up for public use by our public works staff and has been enjoyed and appreciated by recreationalists and fishermen.

* South Blue Hill Bridge Completion. Although not a town project, this state owned bridge is an important element in our Town's infrastructure. After years of planning and meetings and months of construction, the new bridge was completed.

* YMCA Provides Successful Youth Recreation Programs. An agreement between the Select Board and the Blue Hill Y transferred the management of the town's youth recreation programs, including soccer, basketball, track and a summer day camp to the Y. We were pleased with the result - it increased the quality of the programming and saved the Town money.

* New Fire Station Planning. Initial planning for a new fire station was begun, including investigations of an appropriate site. The resignation of our Fire Chief due to health issues stalled this work, but we expect to continue it in 2025.

We are grateful for the many people who help make our Town such a great place, both those who are directly involved in our municipal government as staff or volunteers as well as those who serve the many local non-profit organizations that provide public benefits to us all. We offer special thanks to the members of our increasingly busy volunteer fire department for the critical service they provide, to the volunteer planning board members who have been confronted of late with some very complicated matters and to the other volunteer committees who have assisted us on a range of issues.

It is our honor to be of service to Blue Hill.

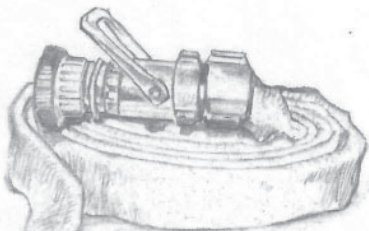

2024 was a good year for the fire department. Our call volume was slightly off with 178 calls for service. The role of your fire department has changed over time. Years ago, we responded to fires and accidents. Today we are jacks of all trades and proficient in many trades. While we still respond to fires and accidents, a number of our calls are for other things, like wires down and trees across the road, medical emergencies, citizen assistance and smoke / odor investigations.

In July, Chief Matt Dennison stepped down to pursue other adventures. He was a 25-year veteran and gave the department eight strong years of leadership, knowledge, and friendship. His presence will be missed.

Your support continues to amaze. I remind the firefighters every day of your support. In a world with so much negativity, the firefighters need to hear the positive and that is you. We are supported with a good budget and your donations keep that manageable.

The department is strong with four new members alone in 2024. Please do not hesitate to contact us if you would like to join. Not all members want to do interior fire attacks or heavy work and there are many other jobs that need to be filled.

Our mutual aid agreements with area departments are vital to us. While we often give assistance to others, they have and continue to give aid to us when we need a hand, truck, or water.

Please continue to be Fire Safe. Please have a have an exit plan and practice drills. If you see or smell smoke, please stop, identify, and alert us. Call 9-1-1. Check your smoke detectors frequently and watch out for your neighbors. We remain your Fire Department.

2024 Report to the Towns

As the effects of COVID waned in 2024, we experienced some new challenges. Staffing continued to be a challenge as full-time employees took leaves as provided under the Family and Medical Leave Act. In addition, inflation increased the cost of providing services. Our business model was able to cope with these challenges and we ended the year in good shape.

With two full-time employees taking time off for personal reasons, we had to use management and overtime to cover their hours. We were able to do this and, in fact, respond to much increased call volume without reducing our coverage. As the year ended, we saw a sudden spike in applications and we have now returned to pre COVID staffing levels.

The cost of doing business has increased as fuel, medical insurance, medical supplies and almost everything we use to provide our services have increased in cost. Our call volume is increasing which results in higher use of fuel and supplies as well as higher insurance reimbursement. Despite these challenges, PAC continued to provide services and adjust our practices to compensate for the increased cost of doing business. In addition, we continue to improve employee wages to remain competitive.

Our largest payor has become Northern Light Health. It accounts for 19% of our total income from patient transports. The new Blue Hill Hospital is now a critical access hospital with limited inpatient and ED beds which means that PAC conducts more transports from our Peninsula to Maine Coast and Eastern Maine hospitals. Movement of patients between hospitals is an important function of EMS. It gets patients to the definitive care they require and frees up local hospital needs for new patients. In addition, the income from interfacility transports helps keep town contributions as low as possible.

Our next 2 largest payors remain Medicare (federal government) and Medicaid/Maine Care (state government). Together, they represent 32% of our payors. However, for every \$1 PAC bills them, they pay only \$0.30 at best. This accounts for most of our operating deficit. If we include all payors, we still are only paid \$0.53 for every \$1 billed. This is a national issue and impacts rural

services, such as ours, particularly hard because ambulance services in more densely populated areas can make many more reimbursable calls in a given amount of time. We continue to support state and national efforts to improve EMS reimbursement rates.

We are proud of our nine full-time and fifteen part-time and per-diem Staff—the Paramedics and EMTs who make the program work. They have completed 1818 calls in the last year and have been steadfast during these trying times. We continue to provide Staff with continuing education for federal and state mandated classes. We believe the morale of our staff is high and we know that they provide an invaluable service to PAC’s seven communities on the Blue Hill Peninsula. We added three staff members in 2024. EMS staffing is an issue nationwide. We continue to explore recruitment and retention solutions.

Our three ambulances allow us to maintain our staffing model of two on duty ambulances with a spare to use when the others need service. This also allows us to staff the third ambulance for local events, such as the Blue Hill Fair, and at times of peak call volume when we utilize management to staff the third ambulance. This allows us to respond to more calls. Our goal for 2025 is to increase coverage in the 7pm to 11pm period to match the increasing call volume.

Totals by town are displayed in the chart below. We set record call volume in 2024. Inter-hospital patient transports, grew from 35.8% of PAC’s total in 2023, to 48% in 2024 and while these are included in the call volume from Blue Hill, the patients transported live throughout the Blue Hill Peninsula.

We cut our deficit in three ways: with the support of our town governments, by individual donations to our annual appeal, and by using unpaid volunteer board members to accomplish many tasks.

This year we are asking for \$24.75 per capita (from the 2020 census) for the operating budget (an increase of \$1.25) and \$8.00 (an increase of \$2.50) for the ambulance reserve fund. This is a total of \$32.75. We are scheduled for an ambulance purchase in 2027 to replace our oldest ambulance which by 2027 will have greater than 200,000 thousand miles on it. We were surprised a few months ago when our vendor notified us that the cost has increased significantly due to inflation, materials costs and labor costs. We experienced an 18% increase with our 2022 purchase. We are expecting at least a 45% increase for the 2027 purchase. This requires an increase in the ambulance replacement fund contribution from the towns with the 2025 budget.

Even though we have returned to pre-COVID staffing levels, we need more Staff and we must keep the people that we have. We must pay our people what they are worth if we are to keep them. Potential new Staff must balance their remarkable dedication to an essential calling with their need to feed their families, pay for heating and keep a roof over their heads. This year's requested increase in operating funds will support staff compensation.

Staff and ambulances are the visible aspects of PAC, but community loyalty and the funds provided by the towns are its lifeblood. Our annual appeal to the public provides an essential and remarkably consistent source of support, but close the remaining gap we have no choice but to rely on the good will of Town governments and the generosity of their taxpayers to understand the invaluable role played by the Peninsula Ambulance Corps.

Tree Warden's Report 2024

A survey of elm trees in downtown Blue Hill, completed in early 2025, netted 157 American elms. The survey included all new plantings, like those in front of the library, as well as our heritage elms and any naturally regenerated elms. They range in size from 5" to 50" with many in the 20" to 30" DBH range.

As expected, Dutch Elm Disease was rampant in Blue Hill in the summer of 2024. Fortunately, the town had voted, that spring, to try to save the elms by injecting them with fungicides. We had two different tree service companies with two different products treating the elms. Small holes six inches apart were drilled all around the bases of the trees and the product was injected, under pressure, into the vascular system. The program was a resounding success. No tree that hadn't previously been infected with DED showed any sign of disease. All in all, about \$11,000 was spent on injections between the Town, GSA, and all the property owners who participated in the cost sharing program. Many property owners opted to pay the full cost of protecting their trees.

Many towns in Massachusetts and New Hampshire have lost all their ash trees to the Emerald Ash Borer over the last decade. EAB was in southern Maine last summer. It is likely that this scourge will come to Blue Hill. We have identified 71 significant ash trees in downtown Blue Hill. There are injections that have a track record of being successful against EAB. I think we need a task force to research products and vendors. I think we will need a concerted effort to keep our town from being denuded of ash trees.

We have about 15 new trees of various species coming this spring for the streets of Blue Hill. I'm always on the lookout for strong tree planters. A resume is not necessary. Call me.

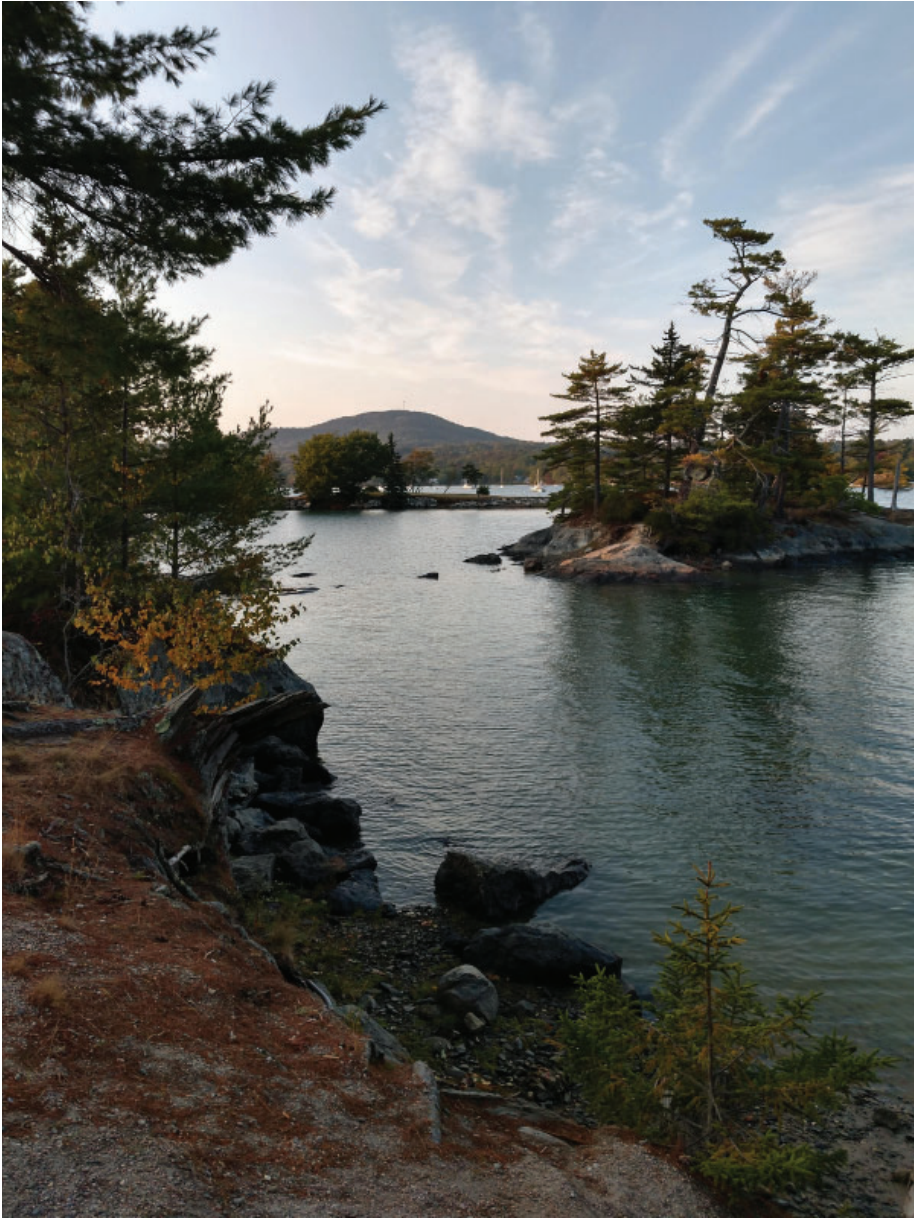

Dear Friends and Residents of Blue Hill,

On December 4th, I was sworn in for another term as your State Senator to represent the 22 coastal communities of Senate District 7. I will continue to collaborate with my colleagues, regardless of party affiliation, to do the best work we can for all Mainers. For the next two years, I will continue to chair the Taxation Committee and serve on the Energy, Utilities, and Technology Committee.

In the 131st Legislature, recognizing the significant impact municipal property taxes have on many of our older neighbors, the Taxation Committee improved the Property Tax Fairness Credit (PTFC) for Mainers over 65. These changes are now in effect for 2024 state income taxes. The PTFC helps Mainers of any age afford to stay in their homes, whether they own or rent, so please review this credit when you file your 2024 income taxes. As the returning Senate chair, I will collaborate with my colleagues to provide additional property tax relief for Mainers across the district and state.

Also in the last Legislature, we increased our investments in roads, bridges, broadband, housing, and working waterfronts. After severe winter storms, my colleagues and I focused on storm preparedness and resilience. We streamlined coastal permitting requirements to allow structures to be rebuilt faster and stronger. We also allocated \$60 million to rebuild commercial working waterfront infrastructure, support other businesses adversely affected by the storms, and enhance the long-term resilience of public infrastructure.

We also made significant investments in education, which helps alleviate the pressure on municipalities to raise property taxes. We kept our promise to fully fund the state's share of K-12 public education, and we set aside \$30 million for the Education Stabilization Fund, in case there is a future economic downturn. We also increased wages for education technicians and school support staff to 125 percent and 115 percent of the state minimum wage, respectively, to improve employee retention.

Dear Friends,

I hope this letter finds you well. It's an honor to continue serving as your representative in Congress, and I take the responsibility very seriously. Thank you for the opportunity to share an update on the work I've been doing for the people of the Second Congressional District.

Fisheries: This spring, the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission (ASMFC) announced a gauge increase for lobsters caught in the Gulf of Maine beginning in January 2025. Maine fishermen warned that this decision is founded on incomplete and inaccurate data. Additionally, this gauge increase could put Mainers at a competitive disadvantage to Canadian fishermen with looser regulations. That's why I sent a [letter](#) to the ASMFC urging them to delay their decision until they can evaluate data with fishermen, whose proactive stewardship provides invaluable insight. I have also submitted an amendment to this year's funding bill that would block federal funding from being used to implement and enforce a gauge increase. Because of these efforts, the ASFMC made the decision to delay the implementation of this new requirement. I'll always stand with Maine lobstermen against unfair, unnecessary regulations that threaten their livelihoods and industry.

Veterans: The first meeting I attended as an elected official was with a large group of veterans and the former Director of the Maine Bureau of Veterans Services. We discussed a lot, but one issue rose above the rest: how little was being done for Maine veterans who needed treatment for mental health issues or substance use. At the time, there were no in-patient treatment beds in Maine, so veterans had to wait for a bed to open up at an out-of-state facility. Fast forward 10 years, through unending red tape, and I'm delighted to report we just broke ground on a treatment facility at the Togus VA Medical Center in Augusta. This was the direct result of the tireless advocacy of veterans from across our state — this win is theirs.

Postal Service: This spring, the U.S. Postal Service (USPS) announced plans to consolidate and move some processing operations from the Eastern Maine Processing & Distribution Center in Hampden to Scarborough. This would have caused significant mail delivery delays that disproportionately harm rural communities. That's why I introduced the *Timely Mail Delivery and Postal Services Protection Act*, which would have halted this planned consolidation across the country. Following these efforts, the USPS announced they have scrapped their plan entirely.

While this is a win for Maine, it is also evidence that we cannot become complacent. That's why I recently introduced the bipartisan *Postmaster General Reform Act*, which would establish term limits for the United States Postal Service's (USPS) postmaster general and require nominations to be confirmed by the Senate.

Regardless of the year, one of my top priorities is ensuring I'm accessible to you. My staff and I can help navigate federal programs; find resources in Maine; and resolve issues with Medicare, Social Security, the VA, and other federal agencies and programs. We are here to help:

Dear Friends:

It is an honor to represent Maine in the United States Senate, and I welcome this opportunity to share several key accomplishments for our state from the previous year.

As Vice Chair of the Appropriations Committee, I have secured nearly \$580 million for 230 projects across all of Maine's 16 counties to promote job creation, workforce training, and economic development; expand access to health care; support law enforcement; improve public education and infrastructure; and protect our environment. As the new Congress begins, I am honored to be taking the helm of the Committee, the first Mainer to do so in nearly a century, and I remain committed to ensuring that federal spending produces real results for our state and nation.

Maine has the oldest average age in the country, which is why I have long prioritized health-focused legislative efforts. There were more than 1,860 health care bills introduced during the 118th Congress. Only 15 health care bills were signed into law, and I was a lead sponsor of five of them. These bills will enhance care for individuals with Alzheimer's, autism, and substance abuse issues through improved research funding, strengthened public health programs, and increased support for rural first responders.

Another important bill that I coauthored was the *Social Security Fairness Act*. Since 2003, when I led the first-ever Senate hearing on the Windfall Elimination Provision and the Government Pension Offset, I have sought to end these provisions of the *Social Security Act* that unfairly reduce the Social Security benefits that public employees or their spouses have earned. I am pleased to say that with the passage of my bill, the *Social Security Fairness Act*, in December, public sector retirees will now receive the full Social Security benefits they have earned.

When the Maine way of life was under threat, I was certain to defend the interests of our state. I worked to protect Maine's potato farmers when the Department of Agriculture tried to reclassify the potato from a vegetable to a grain. I thwarted efforts to consolidate USPS mail operations at the Hampden postal facility, which would have disrupted mail delivery throughout our state. I sounded the alarm with leaders at the FBI and Departments of State and Treasury on the spate of illicit marijuana growing operations that are destroying properties and providing refuge to foreign criminals in our state. Following damage to our working waterfronts after last winter's storms, I secured \$15 million to help fishing communities recover. I championed funding to support the Maine Air National Guard base, Bath Iron Works, and Portsmouth Naval Shipyard.

As of last December, I have cast more than 9,100 consecutive votes, continuing my record of never missing a roll-call vote since my Senate service began in 1997. My ranking as the most bipartisan Senator reflects Maine's tradition of working with a spirit of cooperation and respect.

Blue Hill Heritage Trust

Blue Hill Heritage Trust's mission is, "to lead in conserving land, water, and wildlife habitat on the greater Blue Hill Peninsula. To teach and practice a stewardship ethic. To promote ecological, economic, and community health for this and future generations." Much of our work is future-focused, looking to protect and enhance the long-term health of both land and people, and Blue Hill Heritage Trust is committed to both conserving land in our towns and serving those communities.

In 2024 we conserved over 170 acres on the peninsula. About half of this was focused on habitat protection, with one project in Blue Hill and a second adjacent to our Wight's Pond focus area in Penobscot, while the other half prioritized recreational opportunities across the peninsula.

The habitat project in Blue Hill is a conservation easement, what we are calling our GSA Mitigation property protects a large piece of wetlands north of Penny's Preserve. Access to this land for now will be via Penny's Preserve as we extend our current trail system to encompass select portions of the new parcel. Our primary focus here is to keep this area wild for the animals and plants. As we see more development on the peninsula, these wild areas and the corridors that connect them will be increasingly important for protecting the rural character of our towns.

We want to thank all our Blue Hill supporters for being our partners in this work. We added 25.2 acres under easement in town this year. In 2024, the Trust voluntarily paid \$8,890 in real estate taxes to the town and a total of \$24,603 to all the towns in which we hold land.

We are looking forward to another great year in 2025 and hope to see many of you out enjoying the land and water.

Blue Hill Public Library - Municipal Report for 2024

Hello from the Blue Hill Public Library. 2024 is in the history books and it was a good chapter at BHPL. Below I'll share some information about library funding and usage for the year, but first, let's look at some highlights from the year.

At the beginning of the year, we entered into a new partnership with various libraries around Hancock County, the Hancock County Download Library. Together we are offering a more robust collection of digital magazines, audiobook and eBooks, as well as free access to the *New York Times* digital edition. BHPL offers free access to the *Wall Street Journal* as well. For more information, see our digital services page at www.bhpl.net (where you will also see the recently added Kanopy streaming movie service).

In February we hosted the first annual Groundhog Day Ball in the Adelaide Pearson Room, a new fundraiser for the library. In October we hosted a similar event, a dance with the *Damn, Girls!*, which was a fundraiser for both BHPL and the George Stevens Academy library.

We also made some building improvements; some noticeable, and some not. The bulletin board and water fountain area are much improved, with a new hot beverage bar that serves tea and good coffee to library patrons. We added more outdoor furniture and purchased a new portable stage for larger events in the Adelaide Pearson Room.

During the summer, we sponsored a contest to design a new library card, resulting in two new designs that have been very popular.

One of the best aspects of 2024 is that we sailed through the year with the same great staff. We are 15 regular, year-round staff members, including 4 full-time and 11 (at times more) part-time staff, for a full-time equivalent of 8.6 staff members.

Library Funding

The library's operating income comes from three main sources: municipal funding (now 14% of the total, most of which is from Blue Hill, with additional funds from Penobscot, Sedgwick and Surry), annual fundraising (39%, derived from events, the annual fund, etc.) and operating income (47%, primarily from the library's endowment funds). For 2025, the library's operating budget is \$825,794. This provides the peninsula with 55 hours of weekly business hours over 6 days.

Our active Friends of the Library group provides funding for a significant portion of the library's lectures, workshops, and other public events for all ages, as well as items and services not provided by the operating budget, including performances, movies, and other materials. While we think of these things as "extras," BHPL would be a very different library without their contributions. All told, the Friends gave more than \$35,000 to the library in 2024 and has already provided \$15,000 for 2025.



2024 Activities

From a public services perspective, 2024 was very rewarding with the library providing more programs than our 2019-pre-pandemic benchmark. We engaged a record-breaking 10,714 visitors with these programs, answered more reference and technology questions than ever before, and added more electronic resources to meet the growing demand.

Over our 301 service days the library:

- Loaned 95,161 physical and digital items (books, audiobooks, movies, etc.). Use of physical items in the library collection decreased by 13% compared to 2023 due to the decrease in Inter-Library Loan (ILL) usage resulting from the hiatus of the ILL van service from June to early September. Use of physical materials, not including the ILL data, actually increased in 2024 by 2.6%, and digital library use surged with a 35% increase over last year—both due to an increase in e-book usage as well as the addition of new services such as e-magazines and online access to the *New York Times* and *Wall Street Journal*.
- Answered 4,008 reference questions, 443 more than 2023 and over 1,600 more than the 2019 pre-covid level. Library staff also provided 3,932 technology help sessions to patrons, a 9% growth over 2023 and a 183% increase over the 2019 level. Questions are answered in-person, by phone and via email.
- Served 96,665 patrons; approximately equal with our 2023 visitor total. The additional number of patrons using virtual services is not measured; however, 618 people registered for new library accounts (cards).
- Hosted 18,851 WiFi sessions, a 20% growth from 2023's total, while use of the library computers (3,404) decreased by 15%.
- Sponsored 599 cultural programs that attracted 10,714 attendees. This attendance is roughly equal (+0.3%) to 2023's total and over 370 (+3.5%) more than the 2019 attendance figure.
- Community-sponsored events (meetings, etc. that take place at BHPL but are not hosted by the library) totaled 599, with an attendance estimate of 4,011. These events increased 12% and attendance increased 28% over 2023. The 599 total is 23% greater than the community usage pre-Covid in 2019.

It is our honor to provide the community with professional library services, particularly in this day and age when such services are decreasing in many parts of the country. Thanks to our diverse funding model, this is accomplished with minimal impact on taxpayers and, we hope, maximum benefit to the entire Blue Hill Peninsula.

We end this report with a public "thank you" to Marcia Schatz, who sadly passed in June of 2024. Marcia served the library ably for years, both as a Trustee and later as Library Director, and was one of the major forces behind the renovations and expansions of 1999-2001. The library is much improved because of her thoughtful stewardship.

Dear Town Residents,

I am honored to submit to you this report on behalf of George Stevens Academy. In my short time here as Head of School, I have come to see firsthand why this institution is so important to our community members and vital for the long-term success of many of the young people on this peninsula.

Our small but mighty school is filled with an outstanding student body of emerging scholars, student-athletes, thespians, and our community's future leaders. Our faculty and staff are caring and capable professionals, and our Board of Trustees is dedicated to building a robust future for our school that is steeped in tradition. Along with these wonderful members of our school, we are so fortunate and grateful to have so many community supporters, engaged alumni, and friends. It truly "takes a village."

At the writing of this report, our enrollment stands at 230 students. This includes the following breakdown of students from each municipality: 92 from Blue Hill, 15 from Brooklin, 26 from Brooksville, 11 from Castine, 1 from Hancock, 4 from Orland, 17 from Penobscot, 29 from Sedgwick, 33 from Surry, and 2 boarding students living with host families.

This year, GSA continues to prioritize academic innovation and hands-on learning. We are continuing the long-standing tradition of the Independent Study and Internship Program (ISIP), requiring juniors and seniors to engage in independent, interest-driven projects. This initiative, taking place during the two weeks following February vacation, concludes with a community-wide exhibition showcasing student work. Aside from this program, students at GSA are able to complete year-long mentorship experiences with local professionals and experts in their respective fields. This allows students to gain real-world experience and earn school credit in a hands-on approach.

Being a comprehensive school, GSA offers a wide array of courses and enrichment activities. Students can participate in courses in the creative, visual, and performing arts, in advanced mathematics, psychology, forensics, and many many more.

This fall, our campus has been alive with events that build school spirit and connect students, families, and neighbors. From Spirit Week festivities and athletic events to student dances and the GSA Theater Team's sold-out production of *And Then There Were None*, these moments remind us of the joy and unity a school community can create. Our musicians have also played a key role in local events, enriching the cultural fabric of our peninsula.

Campus improvements have been a focus this year. A deep clean of our facilities, complemented by ongoing maintenance and upkeep projects, along with an invigorated attention to aesthetics, will help to ensure that GSA remains a welcoming environment that is conducive to teaching and learning.

First and foremost, I want to express my gratitude for your ongoing support during my tenure as Superintendent of Schools for School Union #93. It has been a privilege to work with the Town of Blue Hill and witness the remarkable progress at Blue Hill Consolidated School this year.

School Highlights

BHCS remains the largest school in our district, with stable enrollment numbers. As of October 2024, 256 students were enrolled in Pre-K through Grade 8, aligning with our recent annual average of 255 students. Additionally, the Blue Hill School Department currently supports 128 high school students across 10 area schools, with 91 of those students attending George Stevens Academy.

Academically, BHCS continues to excel. I am pleased to report that our students consistently perform well above the state average in both Reading and Mathematics, making BHCS one of the strongest schools in School Union #93. This success is a testament to the dedication of our educators, staff, and leadership.

Under the outstanding leadership of Principal Daniel Ormsby, our teachers and support staff work tirelessly to provide a high-quality education that challenges and supports every student. BHCS is also recognized for having one of the premier *Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS)* teams in Maine. This team of educators plays a vital role in meeting the diverse learning needs of all students, including those identified as Gifted and Talented, further enriching our academic programs.

Budget & Financial Planning

The Blue Hill School Committee has carefully developed a budget for FY 2026, reflecting a **5.12% increase (\$384,097.84)** over last year's budget. This increase primarily addresses rising Special Education costs and necessary salary and benefit adjustments for our dedicated staff. Key highlights include:

- Continued investment in resources to support high-quality instruction.
- Allocating \$25,000 to the Capital Improvement Reserve Account, \$25,000 to the Special Education Reserve Account, and \$5,000 to the Technology Reserve Account to ensure financial preparedness for future facility improvements, special education needs, and central office technology upgrades.
- A warrant article for \$390,000 to repair the bridge retaining wall in the school parking lot. While a temporary fix has ensured safety, a long-term solution is essential for maintaining access to the school.

Your support is crucial in sustaining the success of BHCS and ensuring a bright future for our students. I encourage all community members to participate in the upcoming Blue Hill Town Meeting and appreciate your thoughtful consideration of this budget.

Thank you for your continued partnership in education.

Town Administrator Letter & Road Commissioner Report

Dear Blue Hill Residents,

2024 was a busy year for our town. We welcomed some new faces into the Town Office and said farewell to others.

Dennis Robertson, Harbor Master for over twenty years, resigned, opening the door for Nicholas Niehoff to step into this role.

Denny - Thank you for all of your years of service as both the Harbor Master and Fire Chief prior to that. Over forty combined years of service is extraordinary!

Matthew Dennison, Fire Chief, also elected to resign, and in so doing, passed the torch to Assistant Fire Chief, John Chapman, who was appointed as the new Fire Chief in August.

Matthew - The Town would also like to thank you for your eight years of service, and for helping to protect Blue Hill.

We have a full dedicated crew of employees who work for both the Town and the Blue Hill / Surry Transfer Station. I would like to thank them for their efforts and enthusiasm while we continue making changes to our policies and procedures in order to improve our residents' experience while simultaneously conducting Town business.

Thank you, Sarah, Bryce, Michael, Dana, Lori, Morgan, Hunter, Mike, Kole, John and Amanda.

In 2024, it was impressive seeing the number of residents who dedicated their time as volunteers for the Blue Hill community.

Some examples include:

- The Comprehensive Plan Committee, who spent countless hours and completed an updated Comprehensive Plan that was approved by the state, and if approved by the residents, will help guide the future of Blue Hill.
- The Climate Resilience Committee, who continue to stay on top of current events and possible grant opportunities as they watch for environmental threats to roads and the coastline in Blue Hill.
- A volunteer group, which formed following the April Town Meeting to address concerns from residents regarding the proposed Healthy Ecosystem Ordinance, put together a revised version of said Ordinance for Town vote in April.

I am starting to believe that the talk of a new fire station is following me around. This was a hot topic for years in my last town, and here it is again. While there has been discussion nothing has come to fruition yet. From my experience, this tends to be a long process.

Before I mention some of the noteworthy road projects that are on the horizon,

I must say that the Mountain Road reconstruction project that happened this past summer went better than any of the road projects that I have seen. Vaughn Thibodeau was even able to grant several school groups access so they could hike the mountain while the road was under construction.

Completed 2024 Road Work:

- Parker Point Road - 1.6 miles of reclaiming and repaving, culvert replacements, and a sidewalk extension from Main Street to the Library entrance.
- Tenny Hill - sidewalk was widened and paved.
- Jay Carter Road - A new layer of asphalt over last year's improvements to the dirt section.
- Kingdom Road - The western end was paved to match the newly paved Penobscot portion.
- Stover Road - Pavement was extended to West Toddy Lane, road was widened, and trees were removed with new substantial ditching.

Ben Adams, Select Board member, noted: "This year the Public Works Department continued to blossom. With the new lead person, Morgan Lawson, the Department has started to grow into what we all had hoped. Our goal this year is to add another full-time worker to this team and continue to do more in-house, both capturing savings and efficiency."

Projects for 2025 and beyond:

- Parker Point Road - Sidewalk extension from the Town side of Parker Point to the old fountain parking lot.
- Woods Point Road - The Town section will be overhauled.
- Stover Road - A continuation to rebuild the dirt road to prepare for future paving.
- Turkey Farm Road - Haley Ward will start the engineering as this will be the next road to be fully reconstructed.

In this unique role as a Town Administrator, I have five bosses that change frequently. I am not sure who will be elected to the Select Board in April, but I do know that Jim Dow has chosen not to run again. I have enjoyed the time that Jim and I have worked together, and I would like to thank him for the valuable historical information about Blue Hill that he has given me. And another thank you to the rest of the Board. Having a diverse group of people in charge gives me the opportunity to learn from each of you in different ways, which I appreciate.

It seems that 2025 will be as busy as 2024, which to me is a clear indication that the town is flourishing as it looks to the future. I look forward to the challenges that this position brings and look forward to meeting and working with more Blue Hill residents throughout the coming year.

Town of Blue Hill Budget Committee Report

This year's Annual Town Meeting will be held in the Blue Hill Consolidated School's (BHCS) gymnasium on Saturday, 5 April 2025, starting at 9:00 am. The Budget Committee has worked closely with our Town Administrator, Ms. Julie Atwell, the Select Board, the School Committee, and representatives from the George Stevens Academy to review the proposed budget and to offer suggestions for its improvement.

As proposed, expenditures funded by property taxes are expected to increase by 8.2% compared to last year.

The Budget Committee agrees with the recommendations of the Select Board and School Committee. There are, however, several areas where some additional context may be useful as you consider your vote on the budget articles and other requests.

School Budget - The 2025-26 operating education budget is up 5.12% compared to the 2024-25 budget. Anticipated Revenue from the state has increased by 0.82% which will offset some of the budget increase. This year's budget includes - contracted raises for school employees, increases for high school special education costs, increases in Insured Value Factor (IVF) payments, and adjustments for inflation. The Budget Committee agrees with the operating budget brought forward by the School Committee, noting a current enrollment at the BHCS that averages 255 students (about the same as last year and up from roughly 240 students 10 years ago).

GSA Excess Tuition Charge - George Stevens Academy (GSA) has again requested a \$1,700 excess tuition charge above the state maximum allowable tuition (\$164,900 - assuming 97 Blue Hill GSA students). When GSA initially requested the excess tuition charge four years ago, the Budget Committee approved it on the school's promise that there would be no decrease in programs and services, but this was not the case. Given GSA's decreased staffing, programs, student services, enrollment, and revenue the excess tuition charge has become a financial necessity for GSA. Our conversations with GSA also suggest that they will continue to request the excess tuition charge for the foreseeable future. The Budget Committee supports families and students and, given GSA's finances, therefore recommends the excess tuition charge.

Wastewater Treatment Plant – The Wastewater Treatment Plant upgrade project will likely go out to bid this spring, and construction could begin later this year depending on the availability of contractors. Currently, the earliest expected start of construction would be in late fall. Previously, the Town secured \$2.75 million in interim financing, as well as a \$1.25 million grant from the USDA. To fund continuing operations of the plant in 2025 the town budgeted \$297,150 in Article 45 (which does not include costs associated with the upgrade of the plant).

Highway Department (Roads and Public Works) - This year, the town will continue its road and infrastructure improvements, with some projects extending beyond the calendar year. Notable projects include work on Parker Point Road (sidewalk extension from the town side of Parker Point to the old fountain parking lot), Woods Point Road (overhaul of the town's section), Stover Road (continued rebuilding of the dirt road in preparation for future paving), and Turkey Farm Road (engineering work by Haley Ward, with full reconstruction planned next). Two years ago, the town established a Public Works Department to improve efficiency and fiscal responsibility. Initially focused on tasks such as mowing cemeteries and fields, the department's role has expanded to include more significant roadwork, such as culvert replacements and road patching. Bringing these essential tasks in-house has allowed the town to gain greater control over project timelines and operations, reducing reliance on contractors and improving overall project efficiency. For 2025, the town is consolidating these functions into a single "Highway Department" category. This streamlined approach not only simplifies the budgeting process but also ensures that all road-related expenses, whether carried out by the former Public Works staff or as part of general highway maintenance, are accounted for in one place. This change is reflected in Article 36, which combines what was previously funded through separate articles.

Long Term Debt - At the end of 2024 the Town had \$2,429,739 in bonds/long term debt including the Mountain Road reconstruction. The debt necessary for the upcoming Wastewater Treatment Plant upgrade, \$2,750,000, will bring the long term debt total to approximately \$5,200,000. A full schedule by the Treasurer is included in this booklet. The Maine Bond Bank sets a statutory limit of 7.5% of a town's State

Valuation for long term debt (excluding school long term debt.) With a State Valuation of \$1,141,700,000 Blue Hill will be well within statutory limits.

Conclusion - We think this year's proposed budget provides for appropriate levels of spending and we support the budget as presented by the Select Board.
