**SPECIAL TOWN MEETING**

**WARRANT**

State of Maine, County of Hancock  
Town of Blue Hill

To: Ruth Miller, a resident of said Blue Hill, in said County.

Greetings: In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to warn and notify the voters of Blue Hill, in said County, qualified by law to vote in Town affairs, to meet in the Select Board Room at Town Hall, 18 Union Street, Blue Hill, on Monday, August 31, 2026 at 5:30pm, then and there to act on the following articles to wit:

**ARTICLE 1.** To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

**ARTICLE 2.** Shall the Town appropriate up to \$925,010 from Unassigned Funds and reclassify \$74,990 of funds already expended for expenditures for the repair/replacement of the wastewater treatment plant outfall pipe, with any such amounts expended to be reimbursed from Federal grant funds and/or subsequently funded by proceeds from the debt issuance authorized in Article 39 of the 2026 Town Meeting Warrant?

*Explanation: The Town has voted to authorize the full amount expected to be required for the Outfall Pipe project via a combination of grant funding and general obligation borrowing by the Town. Certain pre-construction expenditures are not eligible for the grant funding reimbursement, and the Select Board believes that it is more cost-effective for the Town to utilize available cash resources to fund these expenditures rather than borrowing while sufficient cash is on hand. When the cash resources are no longer deemed sufficient for the Town's operations, the Select Board would move forward with the planned borrowing.*

**ARTICLE 3.** Shall the Town of Blue Hill authorize the Select Board to dispose of the stand-by electricity generator currently installed at the Town's wastewater treatment plant under such terms and conditions as they deem advisable?

*Explanation: In connection with the upgrade work underway at the wastewater treatment plant, the existing 200kW generator will be replaced with a new one. The Board is considering alternatives for disposing of the existing equipment, ranging from repurposing the generator for use at the Blue Hill Consolidated School to selling it to a*

*third party. Given that this is specialized equipment, the value is difficult to determine, so the Select Board is seeking flexible authority to facilitate the disposition.*
